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HNF is Conferred "People Developer" Certification by SPRING Singapore



Since May 2015, management and staff of HNF had embarked on an arduous but rewarding journey to achieve the People Developer (PD) certification, which recognises the organisational achievement and excellence of HNF through its people.

Briefing sessions were conducted for all staff to better prepare them for the assessment. HNF also engaged an experienced consultant from the Service Quality Centre to provide valuable advice and insights on the preparation for the assessment. The Committee sat in countless long and tiring meetings to fine-tune their respective Category's presentations and evidences to better present the information on the actual assessment day.

The Human Resource & Administration Department also

organised small focus groups for all staff to further instil the significance of the PD certification, and to pass on essential knowledge that would help HNF achieve the accreditation.

On 25 October 2016, the hard work of the Committee and the resolve of all HNF staff were put to test when SPRING Singapore assessors came to scrutinise HNF's systems and processes and interviewed various stakeholders.

It is a honourable achievement for HNF to be conferred the People Developer status on 4 November 2016 by SPRING Singapore. The accreditation is a strong recognition and affirmation of HNF's internal systems and processes in the development of our people. All our hard work for the past 18 months had paid off!

Forging New Collaborations

It has been an exciting and fulfilling year for HNF as we push our boundaries to work with new partners. As we come to a close of 2016, the new collaborative partnerships forged this year would certainly raise the efficiency of our productivity indexes in bringing our services to the next higher level!

NATIONAL SKIN CENTRE (NSC)

Since 3 October 2016, HNF has collaborated with National Skin Centre (NSC) to co-manage a group of stable immunobullous bed or wheel-chair bound patients. Immunobullous diseases of the skin, commonly known as blistering diseases, are autoimmune disorders where the immune system starts "attacking" its own organs or tissues by producing autoantibodies. NSC would identify and refer stable patients to HNF for the monitoring of their conditions and titrating of medications, particularly steroids, accordingly.

To enable HNF to care for these patients, the NSC dermatologists shared their clinical management guidelines with HNF doctors and nurses over an inservice session in September 2016. Points of contact, referral workflow and platforms for information exchange were also established. The dermatologists were very supportive about this initiative and even volunteered to provide direct clinical support to HNF doctors for case discussions and reviews.

"We are very glad that HNF is partnering us to bring care to these bed-bound and immobile patients. It usually costs these patients a lot of money and time to come for follow-ups due to the need to take time off as well as arranging for transport. With this arrangement, these patients can be seen at their homes, saving them time and money. This is certainly epitomises patient centred care," said Clinical Associate Professor Steven Thng, Head & Senior Consultant from Pigment Clinic of National Skin Centre.

NATIONAL UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL SYSTEM (NUHS) & FRONTIER HEALTHCARE GROUP

n November 2016, HNF established a tripartite collaborative agreement with the National University Health System (NUHS) and Frontier Healthcare Group (Frontier) to leverage on NUHS' clinical system, CDoc, for documentation of co-managed patients. Presently, home care records do not reside in the National Electronic Health Record (NEHR) system. Previously, when patients were admitted to the hospital, the clinical staff often did not have updated records of the patients' conditions and interventions received as part of home care services.

With the established agreement, Frontier's doctors providing home medical service to HNF patients staying in the western region of Singapore and those under the care of the NUHS would be able to document the home visits notes directly into CDoc. This would facilitate a smoother follow-up and better care as clinicians in NUHS would now have updated records of co-managed patients when they are admitted to NUHS' tertiary hospital, the National University Hospital, and its cancer and heart specialty centres.

"NUHS is privileged to have like-minded partners such as HNF and Frontier who are willing to collaborate and challenge current healthcare paradigms to improve care for our patients. This initiative facilitates sharing of patient records and clinical notes which are key to care continuity as patients move across different care settings," shared Mr Thomas Wee, Director, NUHS Regional Health System Planning Office.

Expansion of Home Therapy Services



As HNF continues to deepen and broaden our home healthcare services to our patients, HNF rolled out its inaugural home therapy services in November 2015. Tapping on MOH's "Therapy Hub" initiative, HNF collaborated with AWWA, to provide home rehabilitation and home environmental review services. As of September 2016, the therapists have served over 230 patients.

As there was an increased demand for home therapy services, HNF worked with AWWA to bring in additional therapists in August 2016. On top of this, HNF also finalised arrangements in a new partnership with Speech Therapy Works to provide home-based speech therapy services with effect from January 2017.

The scope of services would include:

- Rehabilitation of acquired communication difficulties involving speech and language disorders
- · Dysphagia Management
- Voice Therapy

Echoing the sentiments in Minister of Health,
Mr Gan Kim Yong's speech at the Asia Pacific
Geriatrics Conference on 12 August 2016 on
building a sustainable healthcare ecosystem for
our seniors, HNF will relentlessly strive to offer
more comprehensive services to better support
ageing in the community.

7th Singapore International Parkinson Disease and Movement Disorders Symposium



The 7th Singapore International Parkinson Disease and Movement Disorders Symposium was held from 29 September 2016 to 1 October 2016 at The Academia, Singapore General Hospital. The symposium was extended to service providers in the National Neuroscience Institute Community Care Partners Programme (NNI-CCPP) for Parkinson Disease and Movement Disorders. CCPP is an initiative for the Parkinson Community with the primary aim to enhance the delivery of community care and support by tapping on the well-integrated network of community healthcare facilities. The HNF nursing team is also involved in the monthly NNI multidisciplinary round (MDR) to raise issues faced by patients with Parkinson.

The symposium provided the delegates with the latest updates on diagnosis, treatment, as well as evidence based practice on research study on medication and other modalities from scientists, clinicians and other healthcare professionals.

HNF Assistant Nurse Clinician, Renuka D/O Nagalingham, and Senior Staff Nurse, Corin Low Mei Llan were glad to have the opportunity to attend the symposium. "It was a great exposure and the learning from this symposium would strengthen my understanding of the disease pathophysiology and treatment modalities. I would be able to apply the knowledge acquired into my care plan for this group of patients in my course of work, and share what I have learnt during the nursing in-service education session," said Sister Renuka.

Following the symposium was a CCPP Partners Appreciation Ceremony to recognise the support of community partners like HNF in enhancing patient care and collaboration. A certificate of acknowledgement was awarded to HNF for playing an important role in making a difference in the lives of Parkinson patients.

A Patient's Story

25-year old Min Min (Family has requested for patient's name to be anonymised) has lost almost 90% of her hearing due to an ear infection and is permanently wheelchair bound. Min Min was diagnosed with Neurofibromatosis Type II (Spinal Tumour) in 2008 when she was just 17 years old.

At an age when most teenagers dream of the greatest aspirations in life, Min Min lost her mobility after sustaining a nerve injury from the operation to remove the tumour. She was first referred to HNF in 2008 for the changing of urinary bags and after her discharge in 2009, Min Min was again referred to HNF in 2016 for professional wound care management as she has developed a permanent wound from prolonged sitting in the wheelchair.

Like any other parent, her mother, Madam Tan, hopes to see her daughter well and happy again. Madam Tan left her job to be a full-time primary caregiver for Min Min upon her daughter's diagnosis. Considering that Madam Tan does not have a regular income, HNF fully waived all nursing fees as we did not want Madam Tan to worry about making payments for Min Min to benefit from HNF's services, and to just direct her attention in caring for Min Min.
